Workshop 7: Insularity: differential fact. Unbalance between continental lands and the resolute maritime political action to balance it. Simple insularity, double and triple insularity. Common problems of the island regions.

Island territories differ from continental territories by a series of circumstances related to insularity, that must be taken into account when making decisions, such as, among others: the high added cost of maritime and air transport; the scarcity of energy sources and the lack of an economic environment for businesses. All of this is aggravated in the case of the smaller islands, which may suffer a double or triple insularity, by their dependence on other larger islands.

These difficulties are recognized by articles 174 and 175 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, which establish the need to adopt special measures to reinforce the economic, social and territorial cohesion of the island regions. For that reason, in the field of Integrated Maritime Policy, it is necessary to specify what measures are taken for those territories.
